Annual Toy Show



Superintendent Cliff McClure will be retiring in 2023 ending his 20th year at the helm of PBL, and his 27th year at PBL. McClure served as principal of Clara Peterson Elementary School from 1996 to 2002 and as assistant superintendent in 2002-03. His 20 year stint as district leader began on July 1, 2003.

Throughout the year, we receive questions asking us about The PBL Endowment Fund. This Fund is an investment being overseen by The Frederick Community Wealth Management Department, along with a local committee, that make annual recommendations to the Foundation Directors regarding amounts we have available to distribute to the district.

The Endowment Fund's principle will never be spent, it will only grow year after year thus creating a legacy for our donors. How does this make money for the Foundation?
